





# The Artery

**An artful route to the heart of Hopkins.**

More than a decade in the making, The Artery (8th Avenue between Excelsior Blvd. and Mainstreet—highlighted in light blue on the map) was designed as a friendly, inviting entry to Mainstreet Hopkins for visitors, bikers, pedestrians and commuters. To make your stroll more pleasing, the wide bike and pedestrian pathway is lined with an assortment of public art.



# Public Sculptures: The permanent collection.

**Permanent pieces both privately and publicly-owned.**

While ArtStreet sculptures are rotating on a yearly basis, with a new batch being installed every May, Hopkins also has a growing collection of permanent pieces. While you're out scouting downtown, be sure to enjoy these works as well. You'll find them on the map to the left, represented by the letters A through F.
